Minimum Program Requirements

- Be an unemployed or under-employed
- Be at least 17 years of age
- Have earned a high school diploma or equivalent
- Have access to a computer and Wi-Fi (given remote learning components)
- Valid Driver's License in Good Standing
- Able to Work in the US
- Interest in Health or Social Services Field
- Basic computer skills
- Return to Campus Guide and Protocols



What do Community Health Workers do?

- Lead health education classes to help people prevent or better manage health conditions
- Make home visits to provide more individualized attention or to conduct an environmental assessment
- Help clients enroll in health insurance and social service programs, ex: Health Care Program,
 Child Care Program, Transportation Program, Food Assistance and much more
- Coordinate care for people with complex health care needs
- Advocate at the community level to bring needed resources to the community and its members

CHW'S Career Pathway

Community Health Worker Wages in New York based on 2018-2028 NYSDOL Projections:

Entry Level: \$31,730

Median: \$40,950

Experienced: \$53,150

Graduates from the program reported minimum starting salary in the Median range as above.

It varies based on experience, education and specific job responsibilities.
